

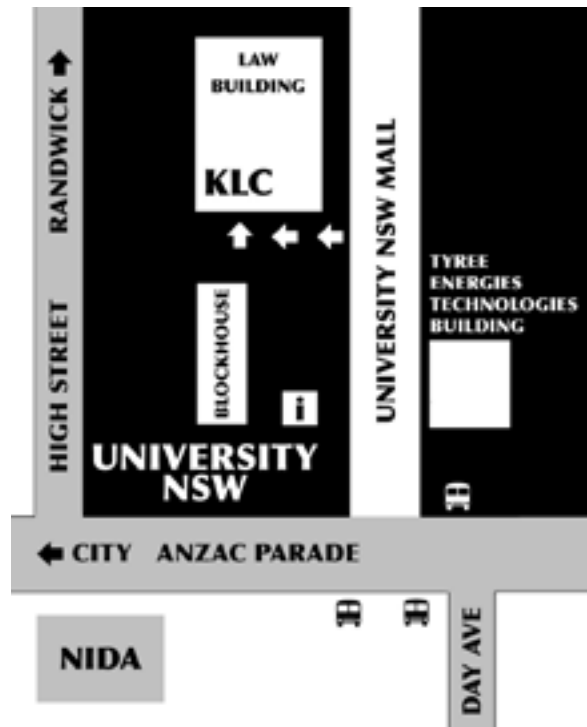
Our commitment to social justice

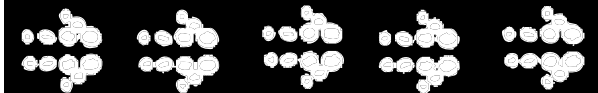

Kingsford Legal Centre

Kingsford Legal Centre (KLC) is a community based legal centre, run by the University of NSW (UNSW).

We provide FREE legal advice for residents in the Randwick and Botany local government areas.

We also run FREE legal information sessions for members of the public and community workers to increase their understanding of the law and how it affects them.

Outreach service at La Perouse

KLC provides an outreach service to the Aboriginal community at La Perouse. The service is delivered every Tuesday morning from 10am to 12pm at Yarra Bay House. It is a drop-in service so making an appointment isn't necessary.

Our Aboriginal Access Worker, Ron Timbery, runs the service so drop-in to see Ron who will help you get assistance for your legal matter.

- Credit and debt
- Fines and penalties
- Motor vehicle accidents
- Traffic offences
- Employment issues
- Domestic violence
- Consumer issues
- Social security
- Victim's compensation
